The end of each word overlaps the beginning of the next by one or more letters. We've given you at least one letter to get you started. How quickly can you complete the circle?




Word Circles require you to constantly think ahead of yourself, making sure each answer fits with the next one.

Spot the Difference



Study the two pictures of a chaotic train station. Can you spot ten differences between the first and the second scenes.


Start at the arrow and work your way around this intricate maze, to end up in the centre of the circle.
